To provide support to obtain a "yes" vote for the ballot question which states "To submit the question of voting a total school tax rate (state and local) of 36.47 mills on the dollar of the assessed value of taxable property located in this School District. The proposed tax includes the uniform rate of tax of 25.0 mills (the "Statewide Uniform Rate") to be collected on all taxable property in the State and remitted to the State Treasurer pursuant to Amendment No. 74 to the Arkansas Constitution to be used solely for maintenance and operation of schools in the State. As provided in Amendment No. 74, the Statewide Uniform Rate replaces a portion of the existing rate of tax levied by this School District and available for maintenance and operation of schools in this District. The total proposed school tax levy of 36.47 mills includes 25.0 mills specifically voted for general maintenance and operation, 7.67 mills voted for debt service previously voted as a continuing levy pledged for the retirement of existing bonded indebtedness, which bonded indebtedness will be retired from the proceeds of the proposed bonds described below, and 3.80 new debt service mills. The 3.80 new debt service mills plus the 7.67 existing debt service mills, which debt service mills will continue after retirement of the bonds to which now pledged, will be a continuing debt service tax until the retirement of proposed bonds to be issued in the principal amount of \$7,180,000, and which will mature over a period of 31 years and will be issued for the purpose of refunding the District's outstanding bonded indebtedness, and for erecting and equipping new school facilities and making additions and improvements to existing school facilities. The surplus revenues produced each year by the debt service millage may be used by the District for other school purposes. The total proposed school tax levy of 36.47 mills represents a 3.80 mill increase from the rate presently being levied." This vote will be on September 18, 2012 and will be held at the Gassville Community Center and Cotter City Hall polling sites.
